

## 2011 Asian Championships Statistics – Men's 400m

Sean Femi Ogunode could be the second long sprinter to win both 200m and 400m in Asian Championships.

Note that QAT won five gold medals but no silver or bronze medal in this event.

Yuzo Kanemaru has gold and silver; winning bronze will complete the medal set.
